Driver Charged With DWI

A Loris, S.C., man was charged with DWI Sunday evening after his car struck the rear of another car about 1.4 miles south of Shallotte on U.S. 17.

According to State Trooper D.B. Harvell's report, Zade Monroe Hodge, 41, was charged with DWI after his 1975 Chevrolet struck the rear of a 1981 Toyota driven by Harold E. Rowland, 20, of Jacksonville.

Both vehicles were traveling north on U.S. 17 when Hodge's vehicle accelerated and ran into the rear of the Rowland car, Harvell reported.

A passenger in the Rowland car, Michelle Rowland, 20, received minor injuries and was treated at the scene.

Harvell estimated damages at \$1,500 to the Rowland car and \$1,000 to the Hodge vehicle. The accident occurred around 6:15 p.m.

Trooper Harvell was recently transferred to Brunswick County, said Highway Patrol spokeswoman Ruby Oakley. Before he joined the district, Brunswick County had been operating one trooper short of normal staff, she added.

State To Issue Discharge Permit

The N.C. Division of Environmental Management has announced its intent to issue a state permit for the proposed discharge of treated domestic wastewater into Jump and Run Creek by River Run Shopping Center.

The permit would become effective Feb. 1 and is subject to special conditions, indicated a notice from Robert F. Helms, director of the division.

The Supply Volunteer Fire Department Inc. will hold its annual meeting Friday, Feb. 8, at 7:30 p.m. at the fire station to elect a board of directors for the new year.

All members are urged to attend, said President Mack Long. The board consists of nine directors.

Deputies Made 249 Arrests Last Year

Brunswick County sheriff's deputies made 249 arrests while logging 842,836 miles on 57,021 gallons of fuel and 788 quarts of oil, according to the annual report released by Sheriff John Carr Davis.

The department answered 8,196 calls and made 2,979 investigations in 1984. Deputies also summoned 380 witnesses and nine jurors.

During the year, 5,130 civil papers

and 22 juvenile petitions were served. Nine juvenile petitions were drawn and 49 mental and inebriate papers were served.

Deputies also served 1,542 local and 594 foreign warrants and found 25 doors or windows open. Six fires were also discovered by the department.

Deputies served 822 hours in court on duty, 165 off duty and 2,490 as duty

officer. Officers made 191 trips out of the county and recovered \$174,267.74 in property.

According to the department's civil reports, \$189,626.52 was collected on executions, \$27,050.49 was collected and deposited into the general fund while 5,335 civil papers were received.

The department also coordinated 130 crime prevention meetings.

Form Needed For Payments

Farmers who make certain rental payments to landowners are required to file Form 1099-Miscellaneous with the Internal Revenue Service when reporting their 1984 income tax, said Steve Suiter, N.C. State University economist.

Payments of \$600 or more a year for land rent are subject to reporting, if made to a person other than a corporation and if made in the course of the payer's trade or business, Suiter said.

Rents reported on the 1099 form also include tobacco quota lease payments.

Forecast Calls For Normal Temperatures

Near normal temperatures and precipitation should continue through the weekend, a change from the temperatures that averaged about 11 degrees below normal last week, said local meteorologist Jackson Canady.

Daytime highs should be in the mid-50s while lows should range in the mid-30s, Canady said. About a half-inch of rain is also expected.

During the period Jan. 22-28, a

maximum high of 56 degrees was recorded on the 25th while a minimum low of 10 degrees was recorded on the 23rd. An average daily high of 49 degrees combined with an average nightly low of 22 degrees for an average temperature of 35 degrees, or about 11 degrees below normal.

Also during the period, only .05 inches of rain was recorded, Canady said. No freezing rain or snow fell in our area, he added.
