Harold C. Robinson of Route 2, Supply, has been reappointed to the Fire Ant Advisory Committee of the American Farm Bureau Federation.


Robinson's committee will discuss issues and programs having to do with fire ants and make recommendations to the bureau's board of directors for consideration.


