

Longwood Man Sentenced To 300 Days In Jail

A Longwood man received a total sentence of 300 days in jail after pleading guilty to multiple charges of assault on an officer, simple assault and damage to personal property in Brunswick County District Criminal Court last week.

Hollie Daniels, 24, of Route 1, Longwood, was charged Feb. 26 with two counts of simple assault, three counts of assault on an officer, two counts of damage to personal property, resisting arrest and trespassing. In court last week, one count of simple assault and trespassing was dismissed. Daniels pleaded guilty to the other charges while representing himself in court.

According to Det. Lindsey Waltch, who testified in the case, Daniels was charged with entering the Holden Beach Grocery Store, assaulting its operator, Eldridge Ludlum, and resisting arrest from Deputy Sgt. Donald Gates and Sgt. Jimmy Bryant.

According to the arrest warrants, Daniels entered the store and assaulted Ludlum by "hitting him in the stomach with his fist." Daniels was also charged with damage to personal property for tearing merchandise "off the displays and throwing it on the floor," the warrant stated.

Sgt. Gates stopped Daniels' vehicle as it was leaving the scene he testified in court; however, Daniels fled into a wooded area on foot. He was placed under arrest about an hour later.

Judge Jerry A. Jolly sentenced Daniels to 30 days in jail for simple assault; 30 days for resisting arrest; 30 days for damage to personal property; 60 days for assault on an officer; 60 days for a second count of assault on an officer; 30 days for damage to personal property and 60 days for a third assault on an officer charge. All sentences are to run consecutively until they are served.

BTC Spring Registration Set

Registration for spring quarter classes at Brunswick Technical College will be held Wednesday, March 27, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Supply administrative campus.

Classes will begin the following day and the quarter will conclude June 14. Students are accepted this quarter for all programs offered by the college with the exception of Practical Nurse Education, which will be open to students in the fall.

Tuition for North Carolina residents attending 12 or more credit hours is \$51 plus a \$7 activity fee. A part-time student who is taking less than 12 credit hours may pay \$4.25 per quarter hour.

While enrollment has decreased at most colleges in the state community college system, a steady increase has been reported at BTC.

"Since students may be accepted in almost every program, we expect a very large enrollment," said BTC President Joseph Carter.
