Hospice volunteers enable the pa-tient to spend as much of that time as the patient's family cope with the il-iness and subsequent death. Lower Cape Fear Hospice serves families in Brunswick, New Hanover and Pender counties. Many of its volunteers are members of families that have been served by the pro-gram


