All association members were urged also to clean up their own blocks.


Planning for the communitywide clean-up was completed at the association's March 28 covered dish dinner at the Sunset Beach Fire House.

According to Treasurer Jean Robinson, the club has made its annual donation to the Brunswick Country of the Coun


