Ms. Mintz said Rebecca will need a

variety of blood components such as plasma, platelets and red blood cells over a long period of time.

Blood units donated Tuesday toward her requirements do not have to be of the same type.

The Shallotte Junior Woman's Club, of which Mrs. Russ is a member, is asking that local persons who donate blood designate it for Rebecca. Club members will be helping at the high school blood drive, Ms. Mintz said.
