# West Brunswick Wins Track Championship

West Brunswick outdistanced South and North Brunswick Monday to win the County Track and Field championship winning 11 of 17 events. The Trojans finished with 112 points while South Brunswick finished second with 52 and North Brunswick third with 13.

The championship meet win raised the Trojans' record to 5-6 overall. "We had great team motivation today which hopefully will carry over into the Three Rivers Conference meet scheduled for Monday," said West Brunswick coach Harold

"Our times were not much better than they have been in earlier meets but the team was just fired up by competing against North and South," Johnson continued.

Last week West Brunswick finished third in a tri-meet with Whiteville and Pender. Whiteville dominated the meet with 114 points while Pender took second with 31 and the host Trojans third with 24.

West Brunswick will be the host site for the Three Rivers 3-A Conference championship meet Monday beginning at 3:30 p.m. It will be the final meet of the season for the Trojans before district competition begins.


