Gore continues to be the Trojans leading pitcher as well with a 5-3 record that includes 78 strike-outs and a team-low 1.74 ERA. Timmy Ludlum is currently 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA while striking out 42 batters in 39 innings pitched.
