**Witnesses Gather**

Delegates of the local congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses will join an estimated 11,500 delegates from across the Carolinas July 4-7 in the second of two "Integrity Keepers" district conventions held in Greensboro.

The conventions are among 112 held in 59 locations nationwide to call attention to the teachings of the Bible, said George A. (Tripp) Sloan III of Ocean Isle.

Said John J. Ontko, convention manager for Greensboro, "There has been a gradual diluting of strict Bible laws and principles for many years so that many people do not know what to believe."

Citing differences in Biblical

teachings and modern-day practice in regard to concerns such as abortion, divorce, rape and murder, he added, "So those claiming to be Christians must rightly ask themselves if they are keeping integrity to God's stated will and commandments."

A Holden Beach visitor was found dead on the beach strand last Thursday morning, apparently the victim of a heart attack, reported Police Chief Raymond Simpson.

W.E. Austin, of 4323 Fredricks Ave., Memphis, Tenn., was found dead lying on the beach near 867 Ocean Boulevard West, Simpson said.

Anne Marie Roberts, of 4760 Woodland Drive, Wilmington, Ill., found Austin, Simpson said. Attempts to revive him were unsuccessful. Austin, who was in his 60s, had been lying in the sand only a few minutes before Ms. Roberts found him, Simpson said.

According to Simpson, the victim had a history of heart complications. He had been attending a family reunion on the beach.

The Coastline Volunteer Rescue Squad responded and transported Austin to the Brunswick Hospital in Supply, where Brunswick County Coroner Tommy Gilbert pronounced him dead.
