Brunswick Tech Begins Fall Quarter Continuing Ed Courses

It will be back to school for approximately 2,500 Brunswick County adults next week when fall quarter continuing education education courses begin at Brunswick Technical College.

Continuing education courses are for adults 18 years of age or older who choose to attend classes on a less structured basis than that which is required for curriculum study. They are designed for self-improvement, up-grading for increased job demands and a variety of general interest offerings.

The history of Brunswick County, its communities and towns, will be the focus of a local history and genealogy course. County folklore and music will add dimension to local history as students research families and collect data on ancestry. The class will meet from 7-9:30 p.m. each Monday at West Brunswick High School beginning Sept. 16. A registration fee of \$10 will be charged.

Designed especially for day care providers and pre-school teachers and directors, the course, Creative Activities for Young Children, is approved for state certification. It will involve a study in the techniques of formulating a creative activities program in daycare, pre-school, and nursery centers. The class will meet from 7-10 p.m. each Tuesday in Bolivia. The course will begin Oct. 8. A registration fee of \$10 will be

charged. For those who would like to add a touch of glass to their lives, a stained glass class for beginners will be available. Basic design, use of stained glass tools, and glass cutting will be discussed. The class will meet at West Brunswick High School on Tuesday and Thursday from 6:30-9:30 p.m., beginning Sept. 10. The registration fee will be \$10.

Weekend Passengers Need Boating Skills Too

Not all the people who enjoy boating are "weekend skippers." Many of them are "weekend passengers"-just along for the ride while someone else runs the boat.

But what if the skipper falls overboard or gets injured or sick while you're "just along for the ride?" Suddenly you are in command and need to know the basics of how to run the boat, how to use emergency equipment, what to do in case of trouble.

John F. (Jack) Ziefel of the Shallotte unit of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary says that the time to learn is before you need to take command.

Before you start, locate the personal flotation devices (PFDs), fire extinguisher, signaling devices and other safety gear. Practice throwing PFDs a line, anchoring the boat and boarding from the water.

Ask questions about the boat and

how it operates. Most owners will talk your ears off if you give them half a chance. The more you know, the safer you'll be if something does happen.

Some of the other things you would need to know are:

How to start the engine.

·How to shift into forward or reverse.

. How to steer the boat. How to stop the boat and turn off

the engine. ·In case of a man overboard, how

to approach the person in the water. How to signal for help.

Rusty Hughes will teach drawing on Mondays from 12:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. beginning Sept. 9.



Hosted by members from District 1, the meeting will be in the East Coast Vinyl Siding building.


A guest speaker is planned, said Jojuan Somersett, and refreshments will be served.
