

Brass Quintet To Boost Local Symphony Drive

A performance by the North Carolina Symphony's Brass Quintet will launch the annual subscription drive of the symphony's Brunswick County chapter on Friday, Sept. 6.

The Quintet will perform at a kick-off event at 7:30 p.m. at Camp United Methodist Church in Shallotte. While the event is intended primarily for

the approximately 100 volunteers participating in the drive, said John M. Harrison of Shallotte, members of the general public who want to drop by will be welcomed.

This fall, the symphony will perform Tuesday, Nov. 12, at 8 p.m. in Hatch Auditorium, on the grounds of

the North Carolina Baptist Assembly at Fort Caswell. At its Brunswick concert, the chamber orchestra will perform works by Handel, J.S. Bach, Kabalevsky and Mendelssohn under the baton of Associate Conductor James Ogle.

"We are hoping to fill Hatch

Auditorium," said Harrison. "It has a seating capacity of about 1,000. Last year we had about 389 in attendance, about 40 percent. We would love to have 100 percent capacity."
