Grand Jury Indicts Four

Brunswick County Grand Jury Monday handed down two true bills of indictment against Walter Lee Graham, 28, of Wilmington, one of two suspects charged in the Aug. 7 death of a Route 4, Leland, girl.

He is charged with felonious hit and run and involuntary manslaughter in the death of Regina Mae Sullivan, 16, who was struck on Aug. 6 by a car that crossed the center line of RPR 1419, Northwest Road. She died the following morning in New Hanover Memorial Hospital, Wilmington.

The district attorney did not present a case to the Grand Jury against a second man, Amilio Resto, 28, of Wilmington, also charged in the incident.

Also indicted Monday were the following:

•Lindsey J. Simmons Jr. was indicted on a charge of second degree sex offense and second degree rape;

•Thomas Paul Grotzinger, on single charges of taking indecent liberties and first degree sex offense;

•Johnnie George Cox, who is charged with assaulting a law officer with a firearm in an April incident that involved Highway Patrol Trooper Joel Dove.
