Feed Hummingbirds Until Oct. 1

Hummingbird feeders should be kept filled until October 1, weather permitting, but no longer, was the advice of committee chairman Emogene Reynolds at the Sept. 12 meeting of the Sunset Sands Garden Club.

If feeders are filled past Oct. 1, the birds could be tempted to remain in

the area past their normal migration time and not be able to find food on their southward journey.


