Head Start Centers Offer Free, Reduced-Price Meals

SENCLand Community Action Inc. will sponsor child care food programs in several area Head Start centers.

Cedar Grove Head Start in Supply, Northwest Head Start in Leland and Longwood Head Start in Longwood will serve meals to enrolled children from eligible families at no extra charge.

The meals will be provided without regard to age, race, color, national

origin, sex, or handicap.

Family size and income standards will be used to determine eligibility. For example, youngsters whose family of four has a yearly income of \$13,845 would be eligible for free meals. A child whose family of four has a yearly income of \$19,703 would be eligible for reduced lunches.

Company Would Place Fill In Caw Caw Swamp Wetlands

A development company is seeking permission from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to place approximately 9,600 cubic yards of dredged materials in wetlands adjacent to Caw Caw Swamp near Grissettown.

Plans submitted by Franklin Gore, applicant for GSH Associates of Route 6, Shallotte, indicate the company would construct 12 ditches to drain a road and residential lots in Vinwood Subdivision. They would be built to 10-foot top widths, two-foot bottom widths and five-foot depths. The dredged material would be placed adjacent to the ditches as they run from a Clearview Drive, a private subdivision road on high ground, through bottomland and hardwood wetlands to the channel of Caw Caw Swamp.

The project site is off S.R. 1315 between Grissettown and Longwood.

This proposal is being reviewed for issuance of a water quality certification by the N.C. Division of Environmental Management; dredge/fill and CAMA permits by the N.C. Division of Coastal Management; an easement from the N.C. Department of Administration to "fill or otherwise occupy" state-owned submerged land; and approval of an erosion and sedimentation control plan by the N.C. Division of Land Resources.

South Principal Faces Charge

The principal of South Brunswick High School, Mose Lewis, will appear in Brunswick County District Court Thursday on a charge of assaulting a former student.

Lewis, according to a warrant taken out by the student, is accused of assaulting Bill Shaw, 17, of Long Beach, on Aug. 30 by "putting his arm around his (Shaw's) neck and pushing him through a window."

If any of the state or local permits are denied, the Department of Army permit will be denied.

The decision on whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact (including cumulative ones) of the proposed activity and its intended use on the public interest.

The Army's decision will not be made until after the state takes final action in the issuance of the Clean Water Act certification, on or after Oct. 15.

Comments will be received by Wilmington office of the Army Corps of Engineers and the N.C. Division of Environmental Management on the project, and interested parties may request a hearing.
