New Seniors Council Takes Stand On Shots

Officers of a new Brunswick County Senior Citizens Council are opposing a proposed \$5 fee for flu shots offered as part of a preventive health care program by the county health department.

"We would like to go on record stating that we think the \$5 cost for seniors to get the flu shot is too high," said Grace Peoples of Supply, second vice president. "We wish to contact our county commissioners and tell them."

The fee was approved by commissioners on a split vote last week, sub-

ject to approval of the planning board. Health Director Thomas Blum had told commissioners if they thought the fee would be a problem for some seniors, the county could go back to charging \$3. Two commissioners had said some seniors couldn't afford the \$5.

Henry Heichart of Calabash was elected president of the new council, while Bill Dunn of Boiling Spring Lakes is first vice-president. Flora Ritter of Shell Point was elected

secretary and Lena Beacham her assistant, said Ouida Hewett, senior adult coordinator for the Voluntary Action Center.

The council discussed possible countywide senior activities with Doreen Vereen, special populations coordinator with the Brunswick County Parks and Recreation Department. Ideas include a mail-carrier check service, calling service, musical activities such as a chorus or barber shop quartet and

organizing volunteers.

Seniors could fill two volunteer openings to help with swimming and bowling programs for students in the Interagency Opportunities program at Brunswick Technical College, Mrs. Hewett said. Volunteers should call the college.

The group meets next on Tuesday, Oct. 15. Officers of all senior citizens clubs are encouraged to attend, she said.
