Following the ceremony, the parents of the bride gave a reception at Whitey's El-Berta Motor Inn.

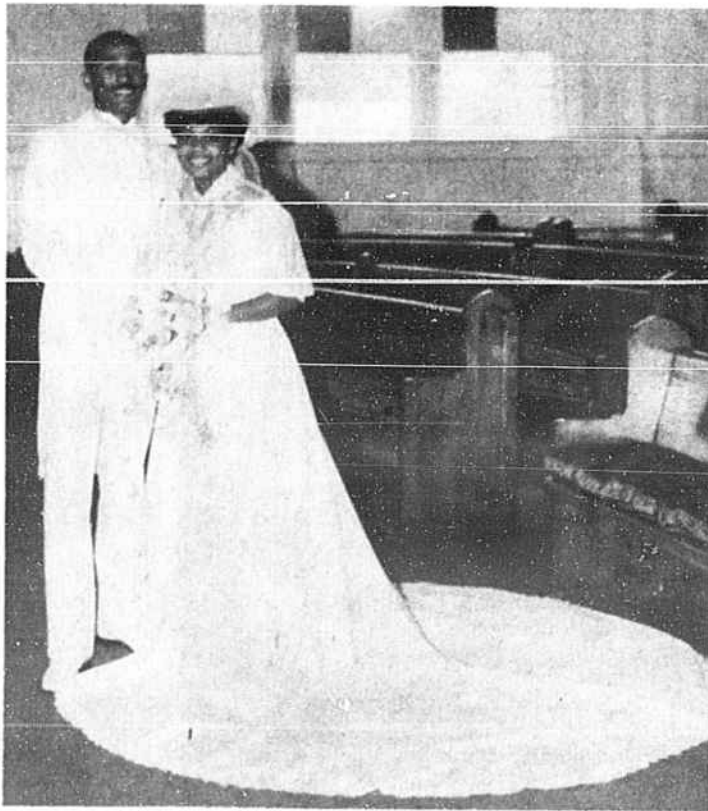
Mr. and Mrs. David L. Gore Sr., parents of the groom, gave a rehearsal dinner in the church fellowship hall.
