Literacy Training Offered

A workshop for individuals interested in helping combat illiteracy in Brunswick County will be held at Brunswick Technical College Nov. 8-12.

Sponsored by the Brunswick County Literacy Council, the 12-hour workshop will train volunteers in the use of the Laubach method of tutoring adult non-readers on a one-to-one basis.

The approach emphasizes phonetics and association skills and can be used by anyone who knows how to read and enjoys working with people, said George Clementson, chairman of the council.

Prospective tutors are particularly needed in the Ash, Winnabow and Leland areas where students are on a waiting list. Persons who do not want to tutor, but who are interested in volunteering in other capacities or interested in learning more about the literacy movement are encouraged to attend, Clementson added.

The cost of the workshop is \$10, except for senior citizens, who may enroll at no charge. Sessions will be held in a mobile classroom near the Brunswick Technical College administrative building adjacent to Supply Baptist Church on U.S. 17.

Students will meet in four three-hour sessions, 7 p.m.-10 p.m. Friday, from 9 a.m.-noon and 1 p.m.-4 p.m. Saturday, and from 2 p.m.-5 p.m. Sunday. They are asked to bring a bag lunch on Saturday. Drinks and break-time refreshments will be provided.

Certificates will be awarded and tutoring materials are provided at no extra charge. Leading the workshop will be Mrs. Ruth Whitley of Whiteville, trainer with the Columbus County Literacy Council.

Towns Receive \$263,000 In Powell Bill Revenue

Eleven Brunswick County municipalities will share \$263,364 in state street aid allocations this year.

The Powell Bill funds are used to pay for maintenance, construction and improvement projects on streets inside municipalities that are not included on the state's highway system.

Seventy-five percent of the funds are allocated on the basis of population, while the miles of non-state system streets is used to calculate the remaining 25 percent. The money comes from funds produced by 1 and three-eighths cents of the state's 12 1/2¢ per gallon gas tax.

Long Beach received the largest amount of any town in the county, \$106,406, based on an estimated 1984 population of 2,543 and 82.96 miles of non-state streets.
