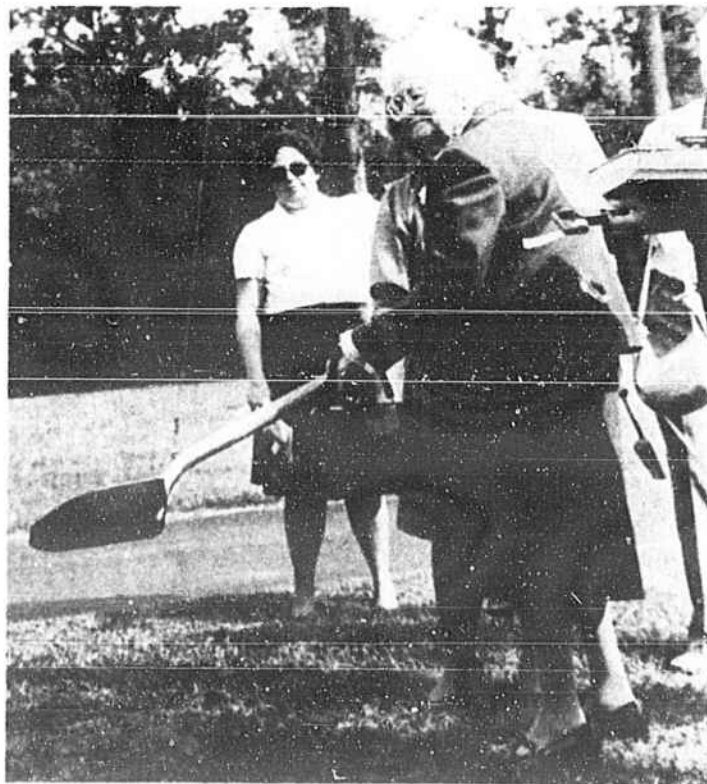
**DOCIA MAE SELLERS**
