

Congressman To Speak At Veterans Day Ceremonies

Congressman Charlie Rose will be the main speaker at Brunswick County's Veteran Day ceremonies Monday, Nov. 11, at the government center in Bolivia.

Colonel Frederick Meyers, commander of the Military Ocean Terminal at Sunny Point, will also speak.

Ceremonies will be held outdoors at the Veterans Memorial. If it rains the location will be moved to the public assembly building.

"The emphasis this year will be the county honor roll we have established," said Jess Parker, Brunswick County veteran service officer.

The honor roll will list all Brunswick County veterans who died while in the service whether they were killed in battle or not.

Each veteran's name and branch of service will be engraved on a plaque.

Names engraved on the honor roll range from that of a Revolutionary War soldier to modern day servicemen.

Parker said the majority of names belong to Civil War veterans. Approximately 140 Rebel soldiers will be listed.

Parker is still researching names and believes he has discovered two Federal soldiers who were also from Brunswick County.

Another large group of names belongs to World War II veterans, but Parker said soldiers from World War I, the Korean War, the Vietnam War and peacetime were also represented.

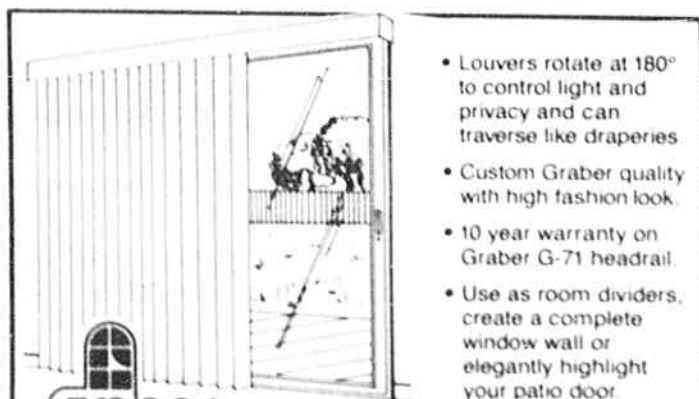

Phone Cable Downed By Truck

Sixty-one Shallotte telephone customers lost service for more than four hours last Tuesday when a truck knocked down an above-ground telephone cable.

Shallotte Police Chief Don Stovall said a truck belonging to T.W. Owens Trucking Company knocked down the telephone line at the entrance to the NAPA Auto Parts parking lot along U.S. 17 near Shallotte Avenue at 3:10 p.m.

A NAPA employee took the truck's license number and reported it to the police department, said Stovall.

Percy Woodard, spokesman for Atlantic Telephone Membership Cor-

poration, said the telephone line was within clearance limits specified by law.

Woodard estimates damages shouldn't exceed \$500, including labor and materials.

"The inconvenience to customers was the real loss," he said.

Both commercial and residential customers, including The Brunswick Beacon, were affected by the outage.

Trucking company officials told Stovall that they would contact Atlantic Telephone to pay for the damages, but no offer has been made yet.
