

Larceny Reported At North Brunswick, Lincoln Schools

Break-ins at both North Brunswick High School and Lincoln Primary School have been reported to the Brunswick County Sheriff's Department this month, as well as vandalism of an activity bus at Leland Middle School.

And at West Brunswick High School, approximately \$300 was stolen from the VICA Club.

Also this month, apparently in conjunction with the approach of the holidays, the department noted in increase in the larceny of cash.

Detective Douglas "Sonny" Padgett is investigating the break-ins at North and Lincoln schools.

Thieves gained entry to North around 2 p.m. on Nov. 6, the school reported on Nov. 15, by taking the screws from glass in the door of the brick masonry department. The school said money and a walkman-type radio were taken and that the suspects set fire to the contents of a locker.

Over the weekend, between Nov. 15 and Nov. 18, someone gained entry to Lincoln Primary School through a window. Taken were two staplers, a microscope, a xylophone and an autoharp.

Pam Hunt, secretary to the detective division, said an activity bus at Leland Middle School was vandalized

the same week. There was no evidence linking the cases to one another.

At West, a report filed with the sheriff's department indicated the money, collected over a period of time in connection with a club project, had been kept in a locked briefcase stored in the school office.

Someone used a tool to pry the case open. There are no suspects.

Other cases of breaking and entering and/or larceny reported between Oct. 31 and Nov. 19 include the following:

Vocational Students Plan Facelift For School

Several hundred vocational students are combining their efforts to give the grounds of South Brunswick High School a major facelift.

Leaders broke ground Thursday at the Boiling Spring Lakes campus for a landscaping project that includes a gazebo, a bridge crossing over a circulating waterfall/stream, wishing well, seating areas and extensive plantings in the courtyard and front yard, said Garrett Wayne Mellor, a vocational instructor at the school and chairman of the project.

Horticulture instructor Teddy Bernard has plants seedling; carpentry students begin the gazebo next week as a six-week project.

In future springs, roses will trail along the fence and dogwoods and pampas grass will soften the landscape. In the courtyard seating will expand to accommodate about 200 students at lunchhour. Small brick walkways within the front courtyard will lead to nooks and crannies for seating. Benches will encircle each of four large planters now standing.

The seating will be needed—Mellor said the gazebo will help bring "culture" to the school in the form of band concerts, fashion shows, art exhibits and the like.

A \$2,000 school grant presented by Principal Mose Lewis and \$400 collected in VICA candy sales provide the seed money for the improvements. Mellor said other clubs

will also raise money and local businesses will be asked to donate materials such as lumber, brick, paint and fertilizer.

"I think with what we have and what we'll get we will have enough to do it," he predicted.

The project started with Lewis' suggestion at the start of the school year that each club adopt a part of the grounds and beautify it, if only by planting a tree.

Mellor approached other vocational instructors and department chairman Carolyn Hankins with the idea of combining efforts in an organized approach and a master plan was soon approved.

The project involves every vocational class—horticulture, health occupations, carpentry, electrical, plumbing, masonry, marine occupations, distributive education, home economics, etc., as well as special education students. Brutus Begley's marine occupations students, for instance, will find a large anchor and collect driftwood for landscaping, while Jessie Best's and Lizzie Mitchell's home economics students will fix up one of the large planters.

"We're talking about 350 students actively involved," said Mellor. "Another 400 will be doing little things here and there."

"We're going to have that many involved in it who will have pride in it and will take care of it and make sure it's not torn up."
