The auditor attributed deficits in two fund balances to a change in accounting procedures.

Current revenues included proprietary funds of \$65,231, restricted funds of \$71,661 and unexpended plant funds of \$106,248, in addition to \$138,720 in plant improvements.

General unrestricted revenues totaled \$2.022 million for the year, with general fund expenses of \$2.04 million, for a net decrease in funds of \$16,553. That left a negative fund equity balance of \$2,522.68.

With expenditures of \$146,845, the unexpended plant fund also showed a deficit of \$13,520.51 for the year.

These deficits resulted from the school's conversion from the cash basis of accounting to the accrual basis of accounting at year end, the auditor noted. "The deficit balances resulted primarily from the recording of liabilities at year end which will be paid from funds provided in the subsequent year."

Balance sheets show fixed assets at year's end of \$2.05 million.

For the year, the college bookstore showed a net operating income of \$7,253.

The college financial aid office received \$7,779 U.S. Department of Education funds for the work-study program and \$60,179 in Pell Grants.

BTC also received a \$2,018 grant from the N.C. Alternative Energy Corp. for a series of solar heating workshops.




