training at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas. He is remaining at Lackland for specialized training in the security police field.

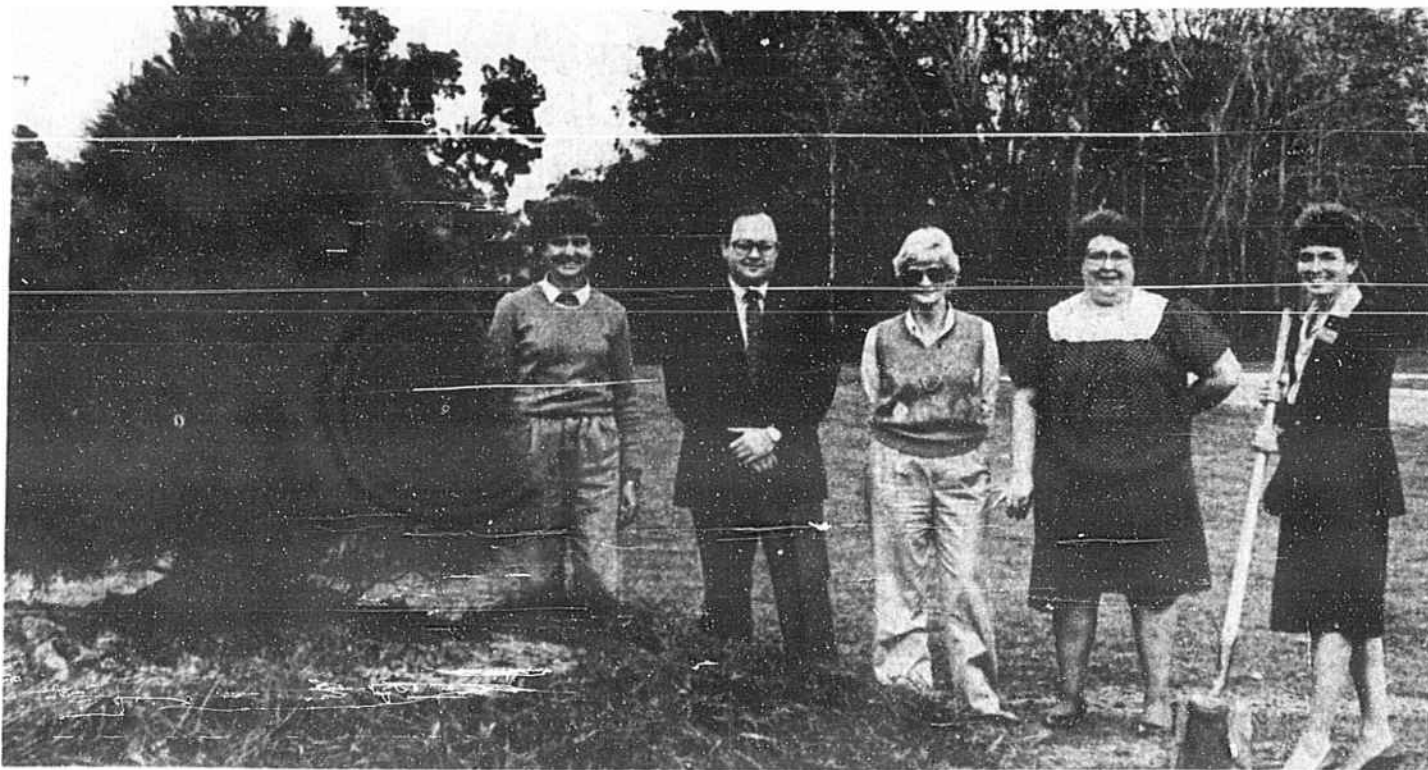
Elected Vice President
