The love feast, or "agape" feast as it was called in early New Testament history, is an ancient Christian rite, said Dr. Stan Smith, minister, who will lead the service

In the early church the feast was probably a meal provided by the Christian fellowship for charity to the poor and widows.

The custom was revived by the Moravian Church in Europe. It was first observed in America by the Moravian colonists in 1753.

John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement, incorporated it into the worship life of the Methodist Church after his association with the Moravians both in Georgia and in London. Camp's service, said Smith, combines both Methodist and Moravian traditions to make the Christmas Eve service a highlight of the church year.

During the service, familiar carols are sung as the love feast buns and







