According to the National Weather Service in Wilmington, June was warmer than nermal but no records were broken.

The highest temperature was 97 on the 8th, and the lowest was 62 on the 22nd. The monthly average high was 79.4, which is 2.8 degrees above normai

Measurable rainfall occurred on 14 days, and on the 17th and 20th, when severe thunderstorms occurred than an inch fell. Thunderstorms doubled above the June average, with 15 during the month, as compared to the norm of 8 days with thunderstorms.

There four clear days in June, 14 partly cloudy, and 12 cloudy ones. with sunshine 68 percent of the time.
