# Town Agrees To Computer Purchase; **Begins Sanitation Contract Talks**

Shallotte Town Clerk Cynthia Long will soon be getting more clerical help at town hall-an IBM computer

Aldermen voted Wednesday to purchase the \$15,000 equipment and software package from Specialized Data Systems Inc. of Greenville. The package includes basic hardware as well as programs to handle water billing and collection, tax billing and collection, budgetary accounting. general ledger and financial reporting, as well as a year-long service

The system is similar to ones installed at Sunset Beach, Ocean Isle Beach and Holden Beach.

It will be purchased in two installments, the first due after delivery. At Alderman Wilton Harrelson's suggestion, Alderman Paul Wayne Reeves added to his motion that the first payment be deferred for 30 days, or until the unit is operable. He said after its first year the

system will become a "manpower saver" for the town. Funds for the initial payment will come from the Shallotte ABC Board,

which Mayor Jerry Jones said ex-pects to have an additional \$8,000 to \$10,000 in revenues for distribution to the town this year. While in the budget for several consecutive years, purchase of the computer system had been put off an equal number of times because of

more pressing needs in other areas. such as major repairs to the sanita tion truck Shallotte aldermen also spent

old similar negotiations with other firms who submit proposals. Last month the town adopted ser-

vice specifications and invited proposals from sanitation vendors. The town decided to make the switch to private contractor because of the increasing demand for service created by growth, and because of the high cost of operating its own department and equipment.

In making the transition from public to private contractor garbage collection service, said Mayor Jerry Jones, the town is discussing trade off of personnel."

In its specifications, the town is seeking a contract that provides weekly residential and commercial ollection, with homes and small businesses to use 90-gailon containers on roll-carts, and larger businesses to use green boxes. Additional collections would be negotiated between customers and vendor. Also, the town wants the vendor to provide rear-yard pickup for residents physically unable to roll the cart curbside and to provide regular pickup of tree limbs and other bulky debris such as furniture.

Other Business In other business, the board:

 Adopted a resolution opposing the "further erosion in the property tax base of local governments." Proposed by the N.C. Resorts Association, the resolution will be presented to the N.C. General Assembly, which in its several hours behind closed doors last session eliminated personal pro-

perty from the ad valorem tax. A legislative study committee is studying a proposal to eliminate all property taxes, but both Aldermen Wilton Harrelson and Paul Wayne Reeves said they didn't think the idea would go far.

 Adopted a resolution declaring Sept. 21-27 Emergency Medical Services Week in honor of emergency service volunteers, with Harrelson adding, "They perform vital services and are mostly unthanked for it. We are indebted to them."

·Agreed to a request from Davis Milligan to extend the paving of the parking lot of his Main Street lot to the town parking lot, with permission to use the area as an alternate exit for his office.
