Celebration Offers Visitors 'Do It Yourself' Art

Art in the Park returns to Franklin Square for the fourth year on Saturday, May 23.

From 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., a variety of artists will share their talents and works with the public, offering demonstrations, "hands-on" opportunities, live entertainment and refreshments.

Midgett III and Betty Place, watercolor painting; and Hope Scroth, acrylic painting.

Live entertainment will feature a local rock band, "Nameless," entertainer Steve Fitzgerald; the

premiere performance of the Brunswick County Band directed by Paul Pittenger; the Sea Notes choral group; the First Baptist Gospel Choir of Southport; vocalists Eva Calaballo and Vickie Bridgers; the Brunswick Players; dancers from the Oak Island School of Dance; and clowns.

Also planned are a bake sale to benefit the Franklin Square Gallery and a soda fountain to benefit the Youth Art Gallery Scholarship Fund.

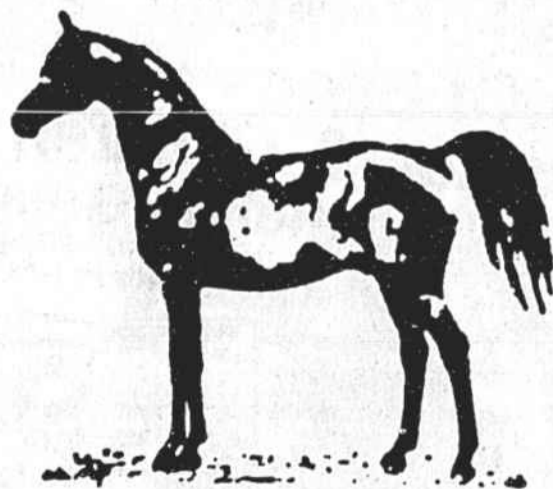
