County Economy Improves More Than That Of Area

Retail sales and new vehicle registrations in Brunswick County were up significantly in the year ending March, 1987, compared with the year ending March, 1986. Meanwhile, New Hanover County and the City of Wilmington statistics were unchanged or reflected only a slight economic decline.

Figures were recently released for Brunswick, New Hanover, Columbus and Pender counties, and for southeastern North Carolina, by the Center for Business and Economics Services at the University of North Carolina at Wilmington.

Barometers of economic health included employment, retail sales, new vehicle registrations, building permits, traffic at New Hanover County airport, and tonnage at the State Ports Authority in Wilmington.

Retail sales totalled \$268.5 million dollars in Brunswick County for the year ending February, 1987, as compared with \$242.7 million for the previous year, an increase of 10.6 percent.
