Local Beach Projects Seek Senate Approval

Funding for a countywide beach erosion study and the annual dredging of Lockwood Folly River Inlet have been approved by the U.S. House of Representatives and await action by the U.S. Senate.

Last month the House approved \$901,000 for the two projects as part of the Energy and Water Development Appropriation Bill for fiscal year 1988.

The yearly dredging of Lockwood Folly River Inlet is budgeted at a cost of \$601,000 by the House, while \$300,000 is budgeted for the erosion study.

According to Keith Pitts, legislative director for 7th District Congressman Charlie Rose, "Everything is still up in the air."

Pitts said it may be November before the Senate addresses the bill because they have yet to study any of 14 appropriation bills on the floor this session.

"It's hard to say when they will act on it," he continued. "We've asked them to strongly support what we've got."

The countywide beach erosion study will investigate damage done during storms earlier this year, said Pitts. The funds will also provide hurricane protection and flood control.

"It's really hard to get federal funding for hurricane protection," he said, "and we hope that by getting our foot in the door, we'll be able to

Pitts said the House approved much of what Congressman Rose proposed for the area, including a \$5.8 million dredging of Wilmington Harbor.

"We really got the most we were able to get," he said.






