Governor's Commission Wants Coastal Region Map

Development of a map spotlighting the state's coastal regions and waterways is one of the goals of the Coastal Initiative Commission.

At its June 7 meeting the commission decided to produce the one-page map, which will also highlight marine centers and historical areas, during its June 7 meeting, said Edythe McKinney. It should be available sometime in September.

Information included on the map will be drawn, in part, from a questionnaire which was mailed to waterway users and local governements which asked them to identify travel Resources Commission, Enroutes, navigational aids needed and services available or needed along the waterway system.

The Commission also decided last week to work with various state comevaluating existing regulations and recommending incentives to local governments to encourage greater resource protection.

Ms. McKinney said the Commission will work with the Marine Fisheries Commission, Coastal

vironmental Management Commission and others in reviewing the state's current approach to environmental protection.

The Coastal Initiative Commission, missions which have authority in en- a 15-member board made up of vironmental protection areas in representatives of citizer groups and marine research organizations, was appointed by Gov. Jim Martin last November. The commission also includes various public officials and the secretaries of the state departments of Administration, Commerce, Transportation, Human Resources

and Natural Resources and Commmunity Development.

Its three objectives are promotion and improvement of coastal waterways, stimulation of waterfront improvements in coastal communities and protection of the coastal environ-






