J. Davis "Davey" Pierce of Southport presented *A Children's Chorus: The 10 Rights of the Child* on behalf of the Brunswick County Concerned Taxpayers, of which he is secretary. It is to be available for use by school system personnel and the public.

Clemmons, who died in March, was a longtime Brunswick County educator. He retired as principal of Lincoln Primary, then served two terms on the school board.

He was defeated for re-election to a third term last November by Republican challenger Yvonne Bright, who is serving her first term on the board.
