Receives Award

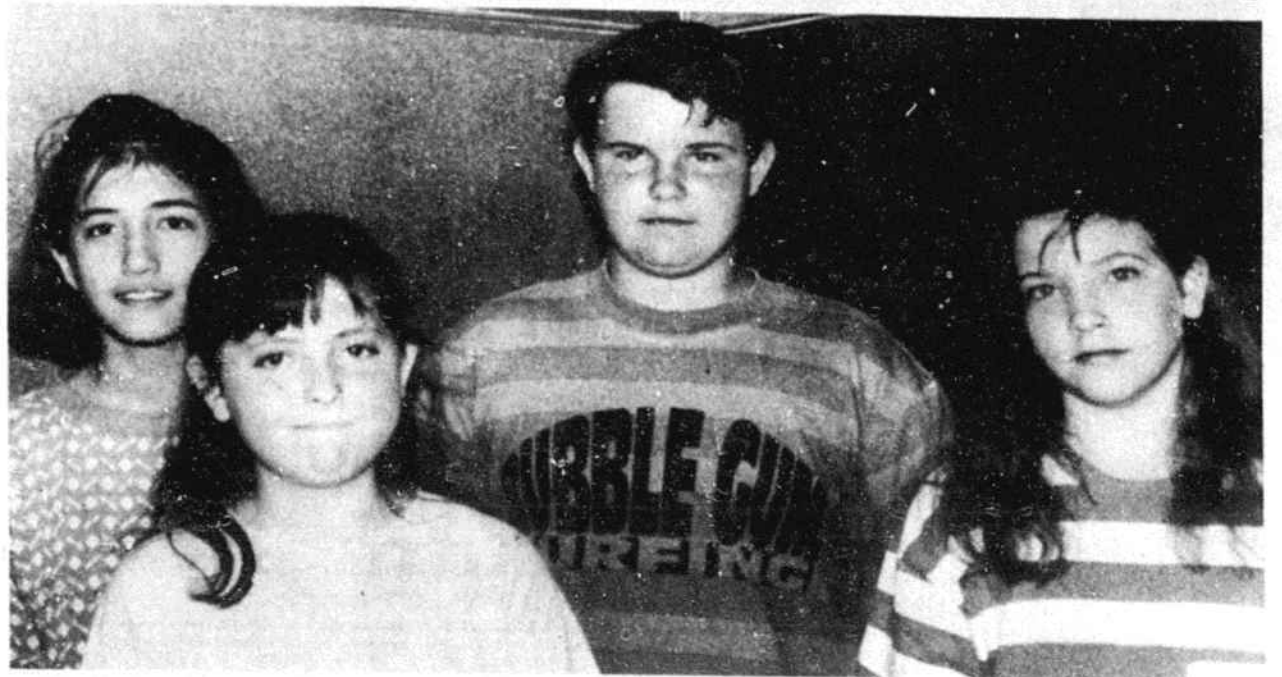
Wayne Stanaland of Shallotte was one of two Brevard College students who received an achievement award in biology at the college's annual Honors Day ceremony April 24.
