South, the regular season champion, collected 32.5 points in the two rounds. West Brunswick was second with 29.5 points and host North Brunswick finished third with 19.


"It takes a whole team to win something like this," South Brunswick Coach Don Millwood said. "We lost some early matches, but the heavier weights came through


