The Trojans overcame shaky play at times to avenge a 55-50 loss earlier this year at South Robeson. The home win also kept the Trojans' state playoff hopes alive.

"I didn't feel like we really outplayed them tonight but we did when we had to," West Brunswick Coach Billy Mims said. "I feel very fortunate that we won the game."
