Child Identification Program Set In Shallotte

What would you do if your child was lost or abducted? Do you have a good photograph to help authorities identify your child?

The Brunswick County Community Watch Association will hold the first in a series of child identification programs Saturday, Feb. 27, from 9 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. at the Wal-Mart store in Shallotte.

Children will be videotaped and voice printed by a Brunswick County Sheriff's Deputy. The records will be kept securely locked at the Sheriff's Department where they will be immediately available if needed for a missing person's investigation.

Video taping provides authorities with quick access to a large number of photographic records that can be transmitted to other agencies involved in a search, said BCSO Crime Prevention Officer Donald Gates.

Voice printing has been found to be a quicker, more effective way than fingerprinting to provide positive identification, especially with children, Gates said.

"Each human voice has a characteristic imprint that can be analyzed electronically and which does not change throughout a person's life," he said.

The identification program is offered free of charge. McGruff the Crime Dog will be on hand to give a prize to all children who participate.
