A new Brunswick County Spelling Bee champion will be named when 17 grade-level winners from six schools compete March 25 at Supply Elementary School at 7:30

Heather Heavener, 1992 champion, lost her chance to advance to this year's finals in the last minutes of the eighth grade bee at Shallotte Middle School Thursday. She stumbled on the word "leguminous," spelling it "lagominus," to finish

However, the field of spellers on March 25 will include another past county champion, Leslie Myrie Jr. of Southport, son of Gladys and Leslie Myric Sr. An eighth grade student at South Brunswick Middle School, Myric was first runner-up for the county championship in 1990, county champion in 1991 and first runner-up again last year. This is his final year of eligibility to compete.

At Shallotte Middle, Caroline Sheffield spelled "oratory" then "alibi" in the final round to clinch the eighth grade spot after Neil Ansley went down on "deficiency."




