

Fullwood, a 5-11 senior, averaged 12.5 points and 8.5 rebounds per game for South during a spectacular 26-1 season. The Lady Cougars won the Waccamaw 2-A Conference regular-season and tournament titles. "She led us in both rebounding and scoring," said South Brunswick Coach Mike Isenberg, who was selected county coach of the year. "She also had quite a few steals and very few turnovers." Fullwood was the most consistent player this season for the Lady Cougars, who were undefeated during the regular season and ranked as the top 2-A tcam in the state for several weeks. "Jenny was the most consistent player. Out of 27 games she only had off games three or four times,' Isenberg said. "She never had a bad game as far as hustling and effort."
