Terry Ehlers had a chip-in at the ninth hole and Rosemary Dobson chipped in at the 10th.

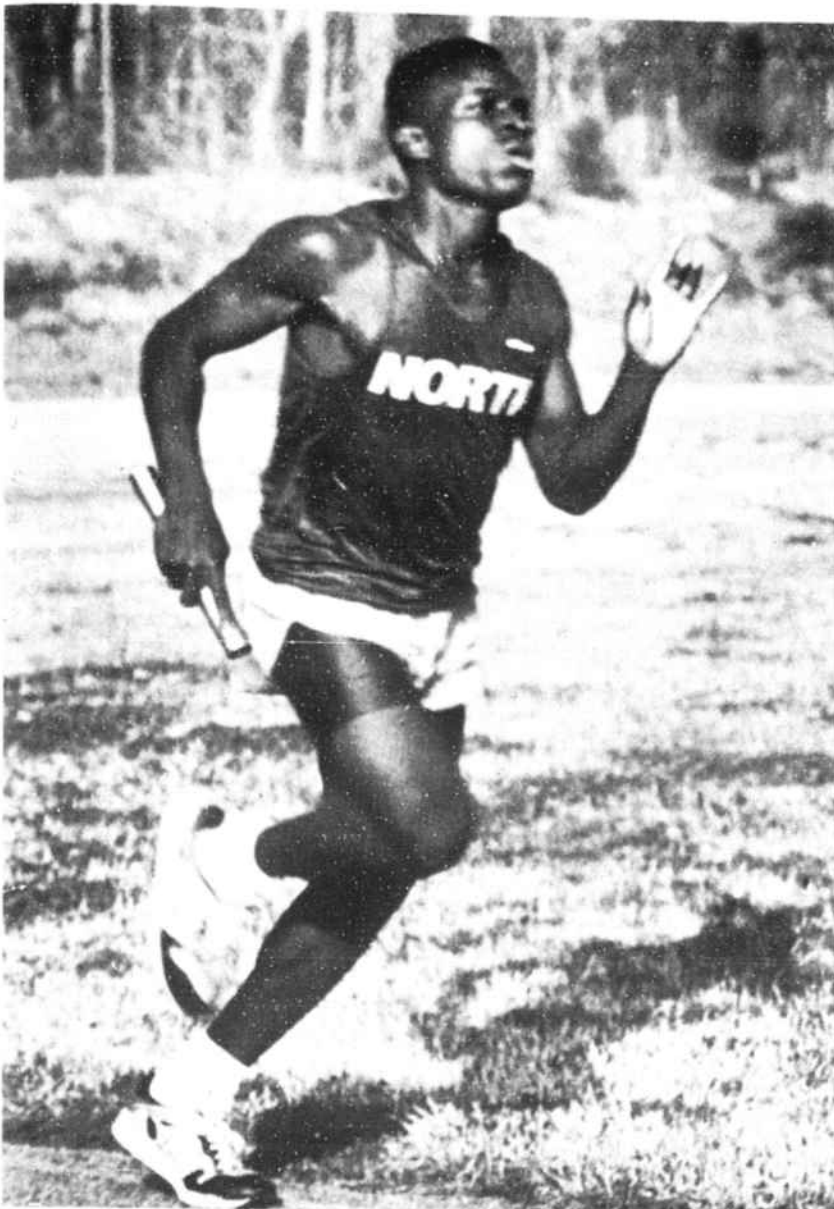
## Literacy Council Sets Tourney

## South Golfers Extend Lead In Waccamaw Conference

South Brunswick's golf team extended its lead in the Waccamaw 2-A Conference race with a victory Monday at Brick Landing Plantation.

The Cougars shot a team total of 329, 11 strokes better than runner-up West Brunswick and 12 better than third-place Whiteville.

East Bladen was fourth with 353, followed by North Brunswick with 356, West Columbus with 378 and Fairmont with 426.

North Brunswick's Scott Roberts was the medalist Monday with a round of 77. Jeff Howard of South Brunswick shot 78 to lead the Cougars. Shooting 80 were Jeremy

Grainger and Tony Shreve of West Brunswick and Brad Thomas of Whiteville.

In the overall season standings, South Brunswick's total of 953 is 37 strokes better than West Brunswick's 990.

Whiteville is third with 998. Next are East Bladen with 1,028, North Brunswick with 1,075, West Columbus with 1,128 and Fairmont with 1,308.

Waccamaw Conference golf resumes today (Thursday) at Fairmont. West Columbus hosts the conference championships next Monday.

## Duncan Selected For Hall

Jim Duncan of Calabash, a former football player and coach and golf pro, will be inducted into the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame next month.

A native of Reidsville, Duncan was a three-time, all-conference football player at Wake Forest University and was inducted into the Wake Forest Hall of Fame in 1985.

He played professional football for the New York Giants from 1950 to 1955 before beginning a successful coaching career. Duncan coached at Appalachian State University and

led the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League to the Grey Cup title in 1971.

Duncan, who retired as a golf pro in 1989, will be one of 15 people honored at the Hall of Fame's 30th induction ceremony May 6 at the North Raleigh Hilton.

Other inductees this year will include former UNC-Wilmington basketball coach Bill Brooks and former pro basketball player Bob McAdoo, who played at the University of North Carolina.
