

## Distribution Slated For June 18-19 The Brunswick County Volunteer & Information Center will conduct

its second-quarter distribution of U.S. Department of Agriculture commodities June 18 and 19 at the Democratic Headquarters in Supply.

The site will be open 9 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. on Friday, June 18. On Saturday, it will reopen at 8:30 a.m. and remain open until the food supply is exhausted.

Commodities allocated to VIC include butter, flour, cornmeal, applesauce, peanut butter, green beans, canned meat, orange juice, raisins and rice.

The commodities program is intended only as a quarterly supplement to other available services within the county," said Angie Fisher, VIC executive assistant. "We are unable to order specific amounts of food because USDA divides the available food supply between all counties.

There are no guarantees that there will be enough of the abovementioned foods to supply everyone eligible for the program. The food is distributed on a first-come, firstserved basis, and once all the foods are given out, there will be no more available until the next quarter."

To qualify, all food stamp households must bring their white commodity authorization card and their green ID card. The white cards should be delivered by mail by the fifth day of the month. A household is considered a food stamp household if it received food stamps during May 1993.

Food stamp recipients who are home-bound or cannot get to the distribution site may designate someone else to pick up their commodities. To do this, the person whose name is printed on the face of the card must turn the card over and sign his or her name above the gray box on the back of the card. They must then put the name of the person they wish to pick up their commodities on one of the two lines to the left of their signature.

For households who do not receive food stamps, the person representing the family must appear in person at the distribution site. The following information will be required: applicant's name, current Brunswick County address, Social Security number, number of people in the household, and income of all those in the household.

The form containing this information must then be signed by the applicant attesting its truthfulness, and that no one else from the household is applying for commodities during this distribution.

Everyone receiving commodities must bring his or her own box or container. For more information, call Angela Fisher at 754-4766.
