The 572nd Air Force Band, Volunteers In Blue, will perform Friday, July 2, at 11 a.m. at the Sunset Beach Gazebo.

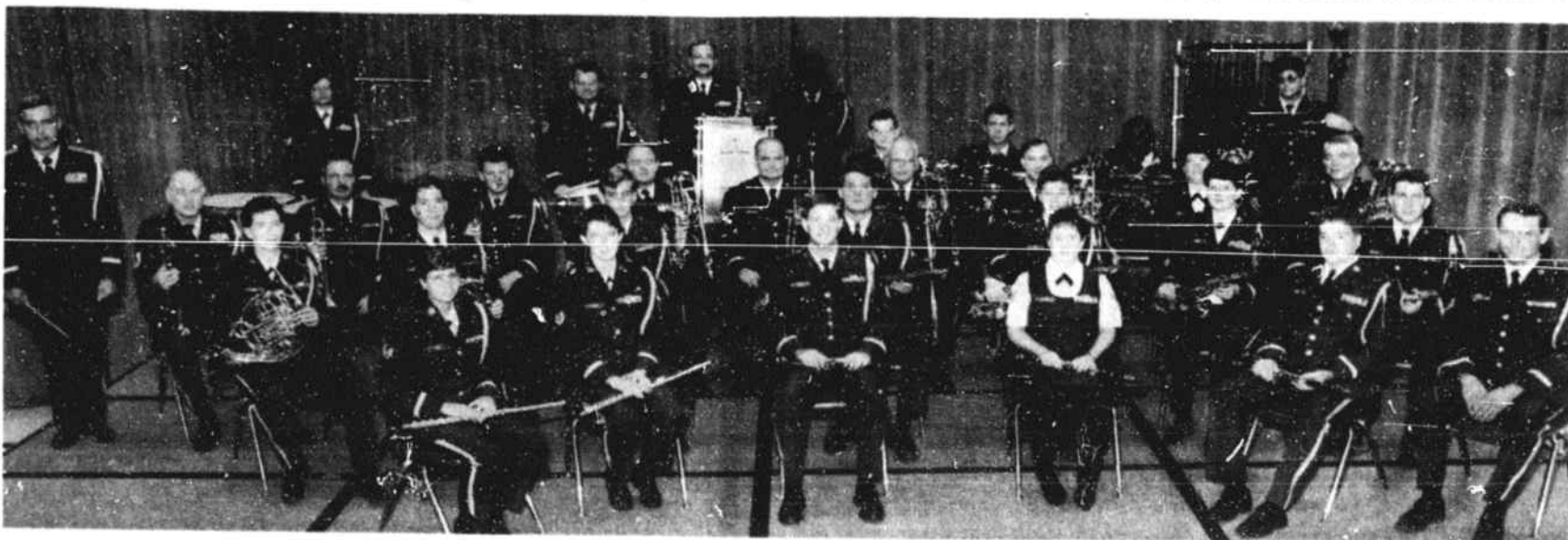
Sponsored by the Sunset Beach Beautification Committee, the program is open to the public at no charge.

Based at McGhee-Tyson Air Base near Knoxville, Tenn., the Volunteers In Blue is the official band of the Tennessee Air National Guard. Its mission is to perform for military and civilian functions in support of community relations activities and Air Force and Air National Guard

recruiting efforts.

Its concert programs typically "provide something for everyone," a news release indicated, including music from the classics, military marches, jazz and contemporary American compositions.

The award-winning band has performed for a wide variety of functions that have included gubernatorial inauguration ceremonies, Fourth of July celebrations, and performances in support of the Air Force Thunderbirds and the Navy Blue Angels precision flying teams. Recently the band completed its first overseas performance in support of the United States Ambassador of Jamaica, West Indies.
