FREDERICK ALBERTUS FOLKER

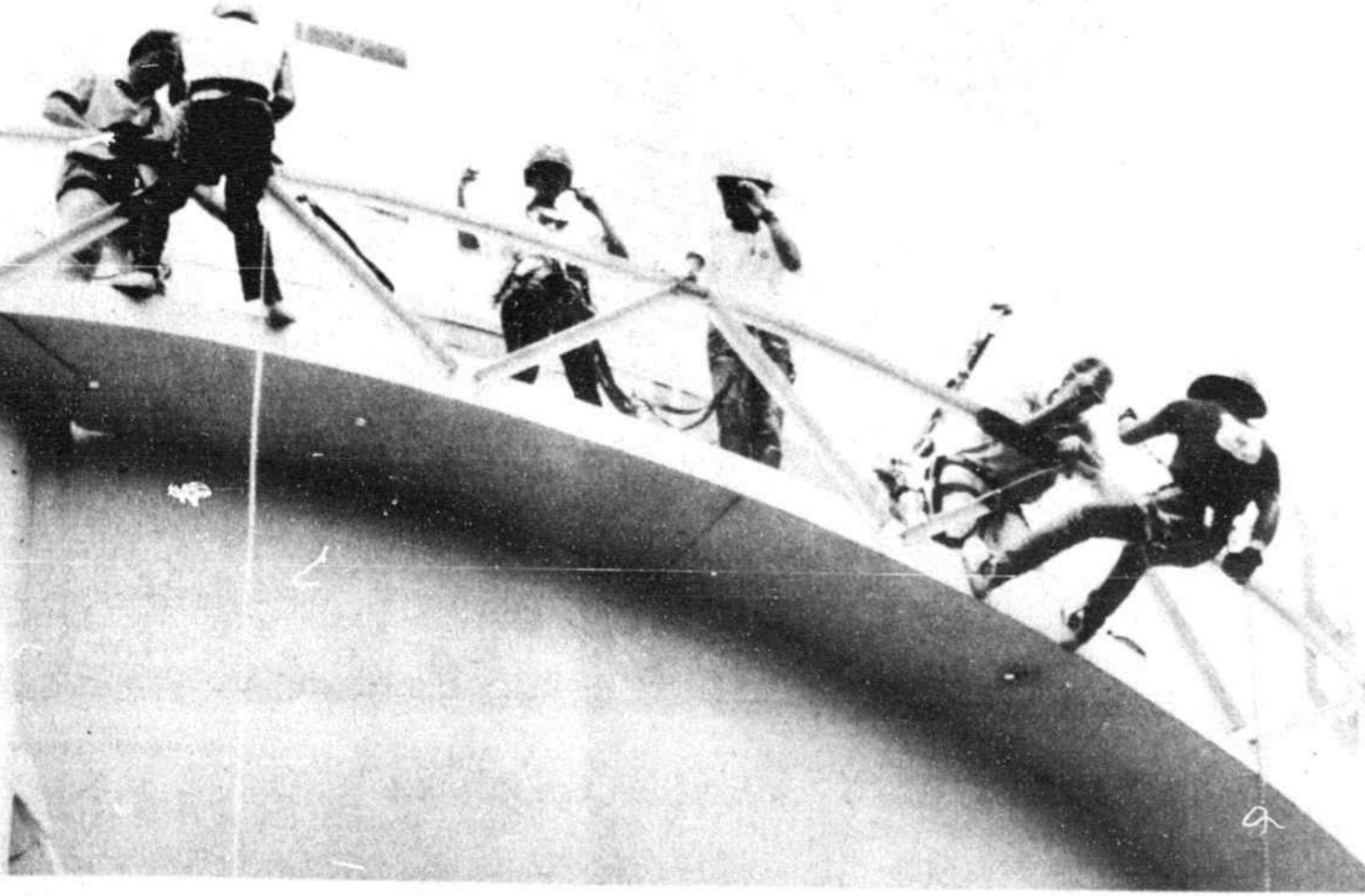
Frederick Albertus Folker, 73, of Oyster Bay, Sunset Beach, died July 3 at The Brunswick Hospital in Supply.
