Coast Guard Petty Officer 1st Class Raymond H. Bitney, son of Dr. and Mrs. Raymond H. Bitney of Southport, recently finished the first half of a two-month Alaskan fisheries patrol aboard the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter Jarvis, homeported in Honolulu, Hawaii.

One of 180 Coast Guard men and women aboard the Jarvis, Bitney is currently on patrol in the Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands and North Pacific Ocean. The ship and crew are enforcing federal fishing regulations and standing ready for search and rescue cases.


