### **BCC Schedules September** Testing Dates For GED

Test dates are scheduled at Brunswick Community College for those who wish to obtain their high school equivalency diploma (GED) during September.

GED tests (any test except writing skills) will be given at Brunswick Community College's main campus, U.S. 17 Business, Supply, on Tuesday. Sept. 14, at 5 p.m. and on Tuesday, Sept. 21, at 1 p.m.

Any GED test will be given at BCC's Southport campus, on North Lord Street, on Thursday, September 9, at 5 p.m., and at Brunswick Community College's Leland campus, Leland Industrial Park, (U.S. 74-76, on Wednesday, Sept. 15, at 11 a.m.

The writing skills GED test only will be administered on Tuesday, Sept. 7, on BCC's main campus at Supply at 1 p.m.

Any of the GED tests, except for the writing skills test, will also be given at BCC's Leland campus on Wednesday, Sept. 29, at 11 a.m. or on Thursday, Sept. 23, at 5 p.m. at the Southport campus.

Students may enter classes for GED instruction at any time. They should phone Brunswick Community College at 457-6329, 754. 6900, or 343-0203, for a listing of classes in their town.

In addition, individualized assistance in preparing for the GED test is available at the college's learning lab in the Administration/Learning Resource Center/Student Center building on the main campus at Sup-

The learning lab is open Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Drop-ins are welcome.
