by Milton Frink. Tressa Reaves conducted the scholarship raffle.

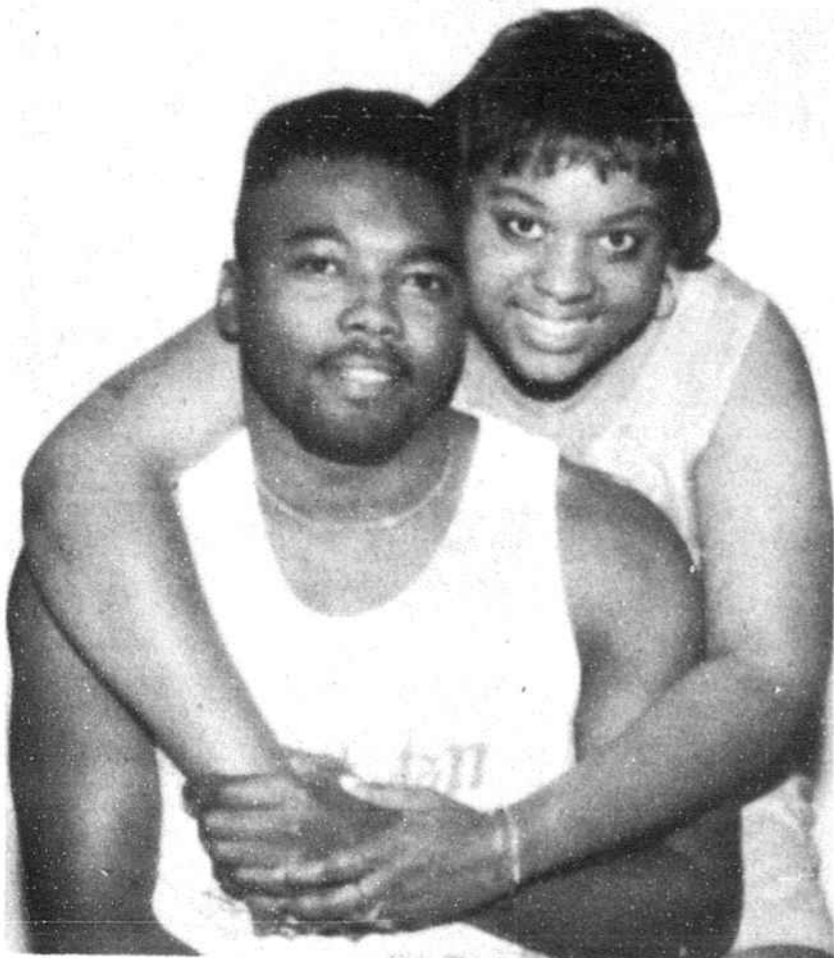
Musettie Gause received a prize as the oldest family member present.
