Shallotte Man's Service Earns Him Commendation Medal

A Shallotte man has been awarded the Army Commendation Medal for "exceptionally meritorious achievement" which helped save a severely injured Tunisian soldier in Mogadishu, Somalia.

Specialist Clifton Woods, a transportation specialist attached to the 507th Corps Support Group Airborne, was cited for quick action and selflessness in a Sept. 18 incident in which a guard tower was bombed. According to Army documents, Woods and another American soldier were able to stabilize the profusely bleeding Tunisian soldier until he reached a hospital.

Woods was recommended for the award by Cpt. Robert R. Russell, a transportation officer, who said Woods:

rendered lifesaving first aid to a severely wounded coalition soldier by assisting in the application of a tourniquet and pressure dressing;

mexercised initiative and sound decision-making during an extremely tense and stressful situation by instantly responding to lifesaving instructions, and acting as a key member of the evacuation team; and

demonstrated extreme professionalism and selflessness by exposing himself to a potentially dangerous situation in an attempt to save the life of a Tunisian soldier.

"His ability to calmly react in a highly stressful environment while applying a pressure dressing and tourniquet was exemplary," stated certificate accompanying the Woods' commendation medal.

It is not Woods' first military honor. He was also decorated for his service in Saudia Arabia during Operation Desert Storm.

A 1987 graduate and ROTC alumnus of West Brunswick High School, Woods is the son of Wilton and Zola Mae Woods of Shallotte.




CLIFTON WOODS is shown in Somalia, where he was recently decorated for helping save the life of a Tunisian soldier.
