County Agency Offers Ski Trips

The Brunswick County Parks and Recreation Department will sponsor two downhill ski trips in 1994.

A trip to Timberline, W.Va., has been scheduled for Jan. 21-24. Cost of the trip is \$199 for transportation, lodging, rentals, two days of skiing and five meals. If you have your own skis, the cost is \$165.

A second trip is scheduled for Snowshoe, W.Va., March 4-7. The fee is \$253.82 per person and includes transportation, lodging, rentals, two days of skiing and eight meals.
