CPAs Offer Financial Advice To Ease Pain Of New Tax Law

If you're one of the taxpayers walloped by President Clinton's new tax law, here are some financial strategies from the N.C. Association of CPAs to help you cope with the tax law changes and ease some of the pain.

Investments

The Revenue Reconciliation Act of 1993 added two new tax rates: a 36-percent rate that applies to single people with taxable incomes between \$115,000 and \$250,000 and couples with taxable incomes between \$140,000 and \$250,000; and a 39.6-percent rate for all taxpayers with taxable incomes in excess of \$250,000

If you're among those hit by the higher tax rates. CPAs suggest you start making deposits early in the year into tax-deferred investments. such as employer-sponsored retirement plans and individual retirement accounts (IRAs). Also, consider taking advantage of tax-exempt bonds.

Generally, municipal bonds are tax-exempt at the federal level, and many are also exempt from state and local taxes.

Capital Gains

Although individual income tax rates have risen under the new law, the maximum capital gains tax rate remains at 28 percent. As a result, it may be more advantageous for people in the higher tax brackets to convert investments that generate ordinary income currently into investments in which the increase in value will be

taxed at the lower capital gains rate upon dispoleaving an estate that is close to these thresholds, sition. Investments that generate ordinary in- consider shifting assets through gifts, trusts and come include certificates of deposit (CDs) and other means. money market accounts.

Sales of capital assets, such as real estate or stocks, generate capital gains. Be aware, however, that a series of anti-conversion rules have been enacted to prevent taxpayers from converting to certain types of investments solely for the capital gain benefit. Contact your CPA for information before proceeding.

Shift Income

You may also be able to reduce your income tax liability by shifting income to family members age 14 or older with lower income tax rates. (Special rules apply to children under age 14). If you're in the 39.6-percent bracket, shifting income to someone in the 15-percent bracket reduces tax on the income you transfer by 62.1

You can also make annual gifts of up to \$10,000 (\$20,000 if the gift is from you and your spouse) to an unlimited number of recipients without incurring the gift tax.

Estate Plan

The new tax law also raised the top estate tax rate from 50 percent to 53 percent for estates of more than \$2.5 million and to 55 percent for estates of more than \$3 million. If you anticipate

Social Security

Single retirees with incomes (including half their Social Security benefits) of \$34,000 or more, and couples with incomes of \$44,000 or more, must now pay taxes on up to 85 percent of their Social Security benefits instead of 50 percent. However, for singles with taxable incomes between \$25,000 and \$34,000, and for married couples with taxable incomes between \$32,000 and \$44,000, the taxable portion remains at 50

If you're a Social Security recipient and can control the amount of income you make in a given year, try to avoid triggering the additional tax on your benefits.

Track Deductions

Tax deductions can provide some relief from higher taxes. CPAs point out that to ensure that you obtain the tax deductions you deserve, you should track deductible expenses, such as medical costs, charitable contributions, and miscellaneous expenses (including investment expenses and unreimbursed employee business expenses). throughout the year.

And remember, the higher your marginal tax rate, the more valuable the deduction.

Brunswick November Jobless Rate Is 12.6, ESC Stats Claim

Brunswick was among four of North Carolina's 100 counties whose unemployment rate exceeded 10 percent in November, according to the state Employment Security Commission's monthly report.

With a seasonally adjusted rate of 12.6 percent, Brunswick ranked third highest in the state, behind Graham County, with 17.8 percent, and Tyrrell County, with 13.2 percent.

Brunswick County's rate is based on a total labor force of 19,820, with 17,330 employed and 2,490 looking for work. According to ESC statistics, September was the only month reported so far in 1993 in which the county's jobless rate fell below 10 percent.

The state's lowest unemployment rate was Orange County with 1.7 percent. According to the ESC report, the commission's analysts regard 5 percent "as a near full-employment situation."

Rates fell in 75 counties, rose in 22 and remained unchanged in 3 counties.

Seasonally adjusted unemployment rates eliminate changes which normally occur at about the same time and in about the same magnitude each year.

November jobless rates in other coastal counties included Pender, 6.1 percent; Onslow, 4.4; Carteret, 5.7; Hyde, 9.3; Dare, 4.5; and Currituck, 2.7.




