At the end of World War II, he was discharged but was recalled to service for the Korean Conflict, when he again instructed Photo Reconnaissance. He was discharged as a captain in 1953. His military awards and decorations include the Bronze Star and campaign ribbons with five battle stars and two invasion arrowheads.

He was with Eastern Associated Coal Corp. as manager of coal procurement. He was a member of Saint Peter E.V. Lutheran Church.

Surviving are his wife, Nell Logan-Evans Thomas, and step-daughter, Jean Logan-Evans Rich of New York City.
