**Literacy County Has VISTA Grant Renewed**

The Brunswick County Literacy Council has received approval of its VISTA renewal application from ACTION, the federal domestic volunteer agency.

As outreach personnel, the VISTAs will serve full-time for one year beginning in mid-June. The federal government will provide orientation, a monthly living allowance, health insurance and either an end-of-year stipend or an education award of \$4,725.

Three Volunteers in Service to America will again support the literacy council's efforts to provide free, private assistance to Brunswick County residents who want to improve their basic reading and writing skills.

**Simmons Is Named To Fellows Board**

Jo Ann Simmons of Ash has been named to the N.C. Teaching Fellows Commission by Lt. Gov. Dennis A. Wicker.

She will assist the commission in awarding college scholarships to North Carolina's top high school students interested in becoming teachers.

"Jo Ann's background and experience in education will help the commission accomplish its goal of ensuring that all our children have excellent teachers in years to come," Wicker said.

The Fellows program was begun in 1987. It awards 400 students four-year, \$20,000 scholarships to study education at 15 colleges and universities statewide. Applicants must be North Carolina residents. To repay the state-funded award, scholars must commit to teaching in North Carolina's public schools for four years.

In 1993, 1,811 high school students applied for the 400 scholarships.

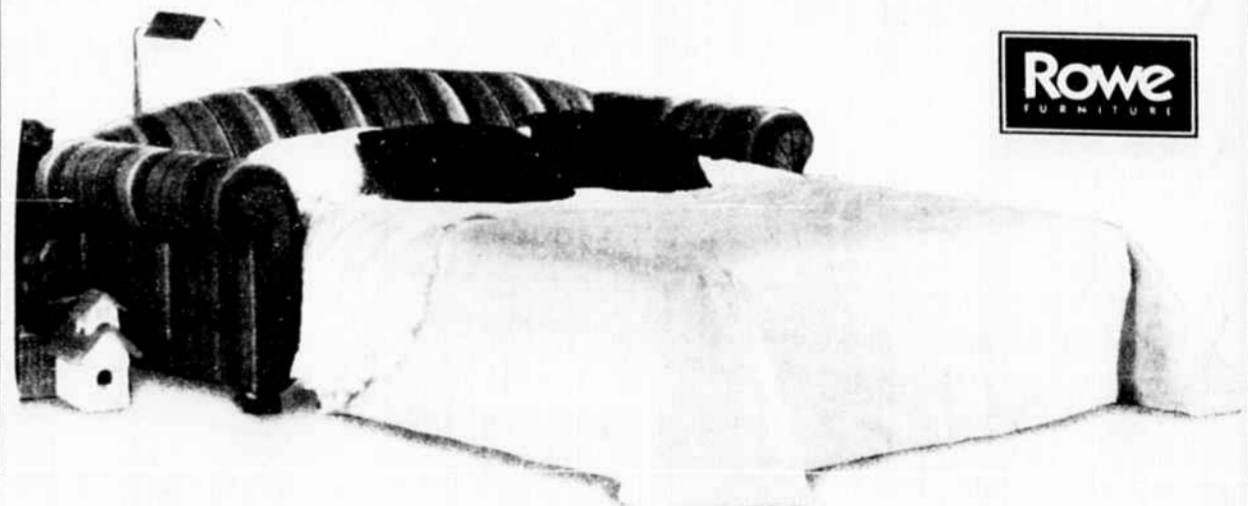
