ALL-COUNTY TEAM West's Stanley Named Wrestler Of Year

He has the chiseled physique of a comic-book super hero. He can almost pass for a fire hydrant. And when he steps on the wrestling mat to do battle, he shows the instincts of a pit bull.

He is William Stanley, a West Brunswick senior who helped lead the Trojan wrestling team to the regular-season county championship and second round of the state playoffs.

And after wrapping up his high school career with a second-place finish at the eastern regional tournament and ninth-place finish at the state championships, he is the county high school wrestler of the year.

Stanley, who packs 160 pounds of muscle on his 5-foot-8-inch frame, is West Brunswick's first county wrestler of the year. He heads up the 1994 all-county wrestling team that features six Trojans.

An outstanding athlete, the stocky Stanley also was instrumental in West Brunswick's back-to-back state football championships during his junior and senior years.

On the mat, Stanley posted a record of 21-4 this season. Over his high school career, he won 65 percent of his matches and finished with a mark of 56-29-1

West Brunswick Coach Joe Noble said strength and quickness are Stanley's strong points as a wrestler.

"Probably the reason he went as far as he did this year was his ability to get the takedowns," said Noble, who was named county coach of the year. "Pound for pound, he's the strongest wrestler in the county."

Stanley, a state freestyle wrestling champion in 1992, was described by his coach as a very good student with a likable personality.


"I think he's very respected throughout the county," Noble said. "He's a very good example of a student-athlete.

Other West Brunswick wrestlers named to the 1994 all-county team were Dexter Cokeley at 112 pounds, Chris Jackson at 125, Ja Mitchell at 145, Eric Andreis at 152 and Steve Brooks at heavyweight.

Seniors Cokeley, Andreis and Brooks each posted more than 50 career wins at West Brunswick. This year, Andreis became the first fourtime county tournament champion. Mitchell is 59-31 in three years at West Brunswick, while Jackson is 50-9 in two years and is a two-time, all-county selection. Both juniors are expected to return to the Trojan lineup next season.

North Brunswick, which pulled off a stunning upset to capture the county tournament championship, placed five wrestlers on the all-

county squad.

They include Danta Alston at 103 pounds, freshman John Bullock at

119 and Shannon Dorsey at 171. North senior Mike Ganey, a threetime selection to the all-county squad, won the county tournament title at 135 pounds and advanced to the state tournament for the second straight year.

Rounding out the North Brunswick all-county contingent is sophomore Adam King. The county champ at 189 pounds, King placed fourth in the eastern regional and ninth in the state.

Representing South Brunswick on the all-county squad are Charles

Herzog at 130 pounds and Justin ments. Coaches were polled for Rohde at 140

Just a freshman, Herzog could have a bright future as a member of the Cougar wrestling team. He captured the county tournament title in his weight class and finished with an overall record of 10-12.

Rohde, a senior, also won his division at the county tournament and is a two-time selection to the allcounty team. He posted a record of 17-7 this year for the Cougars.

Selection to the all-county wrestling team is based on performance during regular-season county matches, the county tournament and individual regional and state tourna- HWT


Brunswick players in double figures with 24 points as the Cougars beat West Brunswick 85-35 Friday in a high school junior varsity basketball game.
