Those were just some of the 14 competitions Shallotte Middle School vocational technical education students entered at the Region V-A Career Exploration Club Leadership Conference and Competitive Events held March 3 at Brunswick Community College and the Odell Williamson Auditorium.

Sixth, seventh and eighth grade students from 18 middle schools in seven southeastern counties participated, with 419-all first-place winners in school competitions-registering for competitions, said Lois Morgan, Shallotte Middle School vocational technical education teacher and regional Career Exploration Clubs Advisor.

Written by the N.C. Department of Public Instruction, the contests were new in format and content to align with the new middle school vocational technical education curriculum.

"No one knew what to expect," she said. "They were difficult and very trying.'
